



WHERE WE ARE

Our diocese is founded on an immensely rich Christian heritage that has thrived and flourished over hundreds of years despite the many difficulties it has faced.





The group of priests serving our diocese is reducing in number and increasing in average age. Over the past 40 years, the number of active priests has fallen from around 340 to just over 100 today. We currently have only 5 priests under the age of 40 and more than half (56%) are already over 60.

Attendance at Mass has dropped significantly too; over the last 30 years or so the number has reduced from almost 100,000 each weekend to fewer than 40,000. The number of churches the diocese needs to manage and maintain has remained static since the 1970s despite the fact that there are many fewer priests.

As we move forward into the future we will continue to flourish - although we will all need to think about our diocese in new and creative ways.

FLOURISHING WORSHIPPING COMMUNITIES

As part of this journey of renewal we will explore together what makes for a flourishing and viable worshipping community. Each of the current parishes in the diocese will be asked to consider carefully and prayerfully the ten areas shown below. The exploration will involve clergy and people working closely together at every stage. They will produce a detailed assessment under each of these headings along with recommendations about the way forward.
